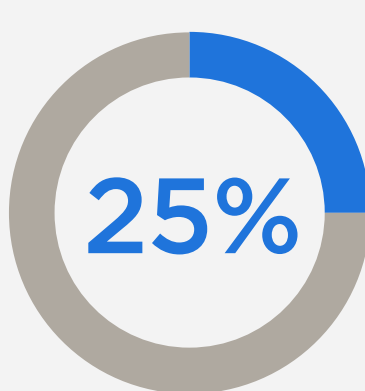
Rising safety concerns for commercial drivers

It involves risks such as an uncontrollable environment and unpredictable actions of other drivers on the road.

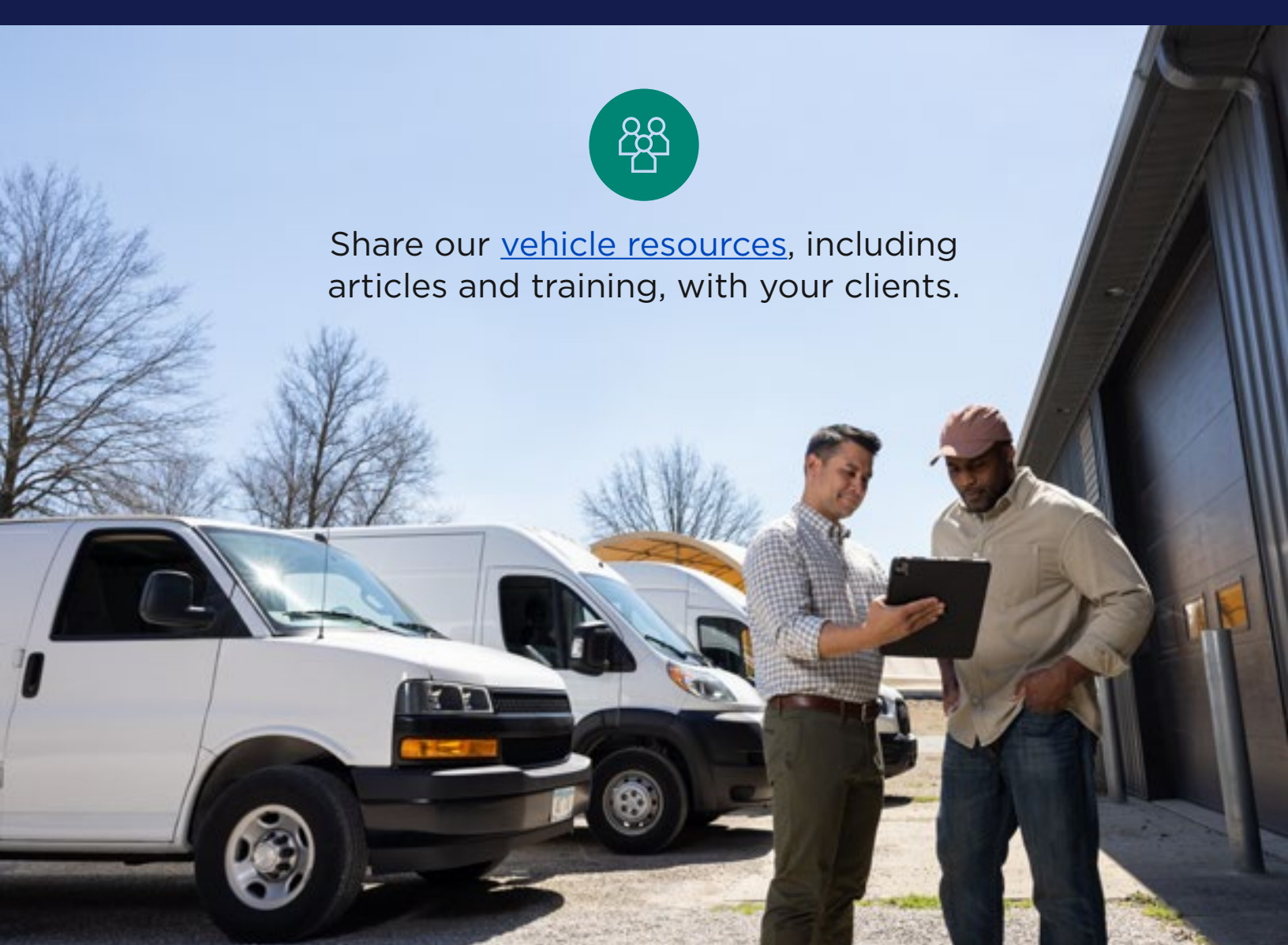
